

THE ELIMINATE PROJECT

The New Jersey District 2013-2014 Service Project

Kiwanis International and UNICEF have joined forces to eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus from the face of the Earth. In order to do this, we need the dedicated work of UNICEEF and every member of the Kiwanis family.

WHAT IS MNT?

Maternal-neonatal tetanus (MNT) is a fatal, excruciatingly painful disease that spreads quickly and affects the nervous system of its victims. Newborns experience painful convulsions and sensitivity to light. Once the disease is contracted, the fatality rate can be as high as 100%. But, it is highly preventable.

OUR GOAL

Eliminate maternal-neonatal tetanus from the Earth by 2015, ultimately protecting millions of mothers and newborns.

AS A DISTRICT WE HAVE DECIDED TO RAISE...

\$93,180.61

- One baby dies every 9 minutes from maternal and neonatal tetanus.
- 3: The series of 3 vaccinations required immunized a mother and her future babies.
- 180: The cost, \$1.80, for the series of 3 vaccinations.
- 61: 61 million mothers and their future children will be impacted by the Eliminate Project.


