Part 4 — Early Treatment for Change: August 27 at 7 p.m.


Part 5- Avoiding Trouble and Possible Incarceration: September 3 at 7 p.m.

On this day in history...July 21, 1916-

the first temporary organizational meeting for a Kiwanis Club in New Jersey took place in the Robert Treat Hotel in Newark. One hundred people signed up to join the club. Unfortunately, the organizer never submitted the paperwork and took off with the dues he collected. Once this was discovered, the club was then organized on January 10, 1917 with 150 members.

Given that this day is the "birthday" of Kiwanis in New Jersey, **Governor Gordon** wanted to recognize the 15 clubs celebrating Milestone Anniversaries in 2020. These clubs represent many of our top clubs in the service and financial support that they have been giving to their respective communities for the past 5-95 years.

Elijah's Promise Gets Key Club/ Kiwanis Help

PISCATAWAY, NJ — As some Middlesex County residents continue to face hardships brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Kiwanis Club of Franklin/Somerset teamed up with students from Piscataway High School's Key Club with their food drive to assist Elijah's Promise Community Soup Kitchen with providing snack items to those in need.

Led by Mitch Fuhr, a teacher at Piscataway High School and Kiwanis Club Treasurer, the service organizations reached out to the community for donations, receiving fruit cups, granola bars, fruit juice, fruit snacks, and packages of tissues and alcohol wipes. They collected enough to pack 100 snack bags for the New Brunswick based non-profit.

"It is a great honor to be able to assist Elijah's Promise in providing the community with some comfort during these times," said Zunilda Sanchez, the Kiwanis Club's secretary who helped deliver the snack packages early last week.

Every payday since mid-March, he and his family buy enough groceries to donate to area food drives.
