Richard Kaufman, Pharmacist, from Kennedy Health System spoke to us on Thursday, May 9<sup>th</sup>. He spoke on Generic vs. Brand-name Medications. Rich asked us what the difference was as we followed along with a print out of a power point presentation. Generic drugs are copies of brand-name drugs that have exactly the same dosage, intended use, effects, side effects, risks, safety, and strengthen as the original drug. In other words, their pharmacological effects are exactly the same as those of their brand-name counterparts. Generic drugs are cheaper because the manufacturers have not had the expenses of developing and marketing a new drug. When a company brings a new drug onto the market, the firm has already spent substantial money on research, development, marketing and promotion of the drug. A patent is granted that gives the company that developed the drug exclusive right to sell the drug as long as the patent is in effect (currently that time is for 17 years.) When multiply companies begin producing and selling a drug, the competition among them can also drive the price down even further. A common misbelief is that generic drugs take longer to work. The FDA requires that generic drugs work as fast and as effectively as the original brand-name products.

Teddy Thomas from the Ronald McDonald House in Camden was our speaker on Thursday, May 5<sup>th</sup>. The Ronald McDonald House is located next to Cooper University Hospital. The House serves as a safe haven for up to 21 families per night. Each family is allowed one bedroom that sleeps an average of 4 people, and has its own private bathroom. The common areas including a living room, a family room, TV lounges, computer room, play areas, a dining room, a kitchen and laundry rooms.

Families whose children are receiving medical care at area hospitals are eligible to stay. Occupancy is not based on economics status, but rather the distance the family lives from the hospital and the severity of the child's illness. Doctors, nurses, or social workers may refer a family. Families are asked to make a \$15 per night contribution if they are able but no one is turned away for inability to contribute.

Groups like our Kiwanis who wish to be involved at the House may prepare a breakfast or dinner for the families. Home-cooked meals provide comfort and nutrition to anxious parents leaving for or returning from a long day at the hospital. Groups are responsible for planning meals for approximately 30-40 guests. If we would prefer we could plan a before or after dinner activity for the families instead of preparing a meal. Some favorites are cookie baking, ice cream parties, arts and crafts, and game and movie nights.

June Bretz from The Volunteer Center of Gloucester County gave us an idea of programs they are working on to increase volunteerism in New Jersey and especially Gloucester County. She joined us on May 17<sup>th</sup>. Nonprofits need to be organized so that they will use volunteers to their best. The volunteer center is located at Gloucester County College. Since we work with children June was open to ideas where we could expand volunteerism in youth.

Millions of Americans observe Flag Day on June 14<sup>th</sup> by waving Old Glory outside their homes and businesses. Veteran's groups and communities also arrange civic functions and special ceremonies in honor of Flag Day.



It was George Washington and two other members of the Continental Congress who asked Betsy Ross to sew the first American flag sometime in the late spring of 1776. The young widow was in her early 20's when she completed the first flag with thirteen stars arranged in a circle.

A year later, the Continental Congress officially adopted the design for the national flag, and henceforward the Stars and Stripes symbolized the U.S. around the world.

The first "official" Flag Day was celebrated in 1877 - the flag's centennial. In 1916, a grass roots movement resulted in President Woodrow Wilson issuing a proclamation that called for a nationwide observance of Flag Day on June 14. Although still not an official holiday, Flag Day was made a permanent observance in America in 1949 by Congress who resolved "That the 14th day of June of each year is hereby designated as Flag Day."
