What did we learn from our NJ Membership Growth Workshop on January 18th, 2014?

Here are some membership ideas that our Greater Woodbury Kiwanis looks forward to exploring. In order for all of our NJ Kiwanis Clubs to increase membership we need to build community partnerships by viewing these outside resources and how they can fit into our mission. We need to make a list of community entities with which we currently co-exist. We can compile this list from Chamber of Commerce directories, yellow pages and other sources. In conjunction with these resources, we can utilize our member's knowledge of the community to create a comprehensive list that we can work on together.

We will need to review the list and determine where relationships have already been created; these are the organizations for which you provide services or those which sponsor our club's activities. Are there others with which you could create relationships? Consider how you can approach them to offer support-and how they would support our club's work. Then we need to determine ways that our club can enhance our current relationships by creating partnerships. For example, consider how our club could provide visibility for the other organization and in turn what visibility we could expect from our work together, how our combined resources could create a greater impact.

Finally, we need to list any groups, businesses or entities with which you already have partnerships. We may even have people in common. Are there opportunities to do more together? The more partnerships our club has, the better our bond with the community-and the stronger our service to it.

It is suggested we use 3 columns to build our list of community relationships and partnerships;

- 1. Co-exist: Organizations, businesses and groups that exist within our club's defined community. (examples: utility company, chamber of commerce, locals, fire department)
- 2. Relationships: Community organizations, businesses, groups and individuals that our club supports or who support us. (examples: food pantry, schools, YMC, Salvation Army)
- 3. Partnerships: Organizations, business, groups and individuals that our club supports and who in turn support our club and its activities. (examples: key clubs, other service organizations, library).

Everyone in our club will be working together to make up this list of prospective community partnerships.
