On Thursday, June 7th, 14 Kiwanians attended an ice cream social at St. John of God School. Two classes with 8 children, teachers and aides joined us at the Granada Room patio. It was a beautiful day for all.

Our Thursday, June 14th noon meeting was held at the County Seat Restaurant on South Broad Street. Our speaker was Joyce Skradzinski, Executive Director of the American Red Cross of Salem and Gloucester Counties. When disaster strikes or threatens, the Red Cross is there. This past year there were 169 local disasters in Gloucester County and 18 local disasters in Salem County. They helped 187 families, a total of 391 individuals with emergency food, shelter and supplies. Thanks to generous blood donors, the American Red Cross collects and distributes nearly half of the nation's blood supply. From first aid, CPR and AED training, and swimming and lifeguarding, American Red Cross programs help people lead safer and healthier lives. The international tracing program helps local families find relatives with whom they have lost contact because of a natural disaster, war or internal conflict. Communication between those in the Armed Forces and their families is part of a worldwide network that reach services members wherever they are to communicate a birth, death or illness. The Red Cross depends on volunteers of all ages and backgrounds to carry out their work. Is there a place for you to volunteer?
