Our New Jersey Kiwanis District hosted Gunter and his wife. His platform for the evening was updating us on ELIMINATE (maternal/neonatal tetanus). Under the leadership of Michael Mulhaul, our New Jersey District has

raised\$632,745.35 toward our goal of \$1,290,450.00. As of February 16, 2014 the New Jersey District has seven model clubs, one 100K club, three major gifts, 72 Walter Zeller Fellows and Carrington-Swain Fellows.

KI President Gunter presented Joan Van Note with an Eliminate Hixson during the awards part of the program. She is happy to help NJ reach the goal of saving thousands of lives. In the last several months, ELIMINATE has offered Eliminate Hixson's for a donation of \$1,000.00 which saves 690 lives through our tetanus shot program (MNT). Gunter mentioned that NJ should be VERY proud that they had 100% giving from all of its clubs: The only district in the United States to have that distinction. NJ is proud to have a per member average a \$281.10 per member, the highest per member giving in the United States. NJ also ranks 5th throughout the world in giving per member.
