

The event is meant to give those in the community a chance to come together to further the cause of the 'spiritual awakening' in our nation. His talk centered on giving to others less fortunate in our daily lives. Amazing Grace Bookstore in Mullica Hill presented each person with a book entitled "The 12 Ways of Christmas" by David Jeremiah. Our Greater Woodbury Kiwanis club had over 16 members attending this program.

Gar Miller spoke to our club on December 3rd on Women in Baseball. In the early 1940's Phillip Wrigley and Branch Rickey started the Women's League. Gar told us that they made \$50 to \$85 a week, had \$2.75 a day for expenses, lived as a group with families at home and on the road lived with host families. It was not an easy life: they sold war bonds, were chaperoned, went to a charm school, had a curfew and were not aloud to drink or gamble. The ladies were not allowed to fraternize with other teams. In 1948 the size of the ball was changed to 10 inches and bases extended to 90 feet. They then threw overhand and side hand to the delight of large crowds. The league died out when men returned from World War II. Gar also brought many baseball cards for us to look over as he talked to us.
